So make a plan, get organized, and schedule

all the time you will need to complete your online course requirements and then stick to your plan.

- [00:01:32] And third, don't be a stranger to your online course. Log in to your course regularly, even daily if possible. This is another strategy successful online learners use. Logging in frequently is associated with higher grades. Consistent, frequent access to your course allows you to respond to important course announcements, review course expectations, and interact with classmates in discussion boards. If you do this consistently, you will build valuable connections with other students in the course and opportunities for cooperation and collaboration, and this will enrich your online learning experience.
